


Honework POEICY

Each day, a list of expectations will be set at the beginning of class and posted to google classroom. The lesson will be taught to students and work time will be allowed. Daily homework will not be given often, but however, if a student chooses to not work during the allotted time, they may need more time at home to complete the assignment. Good reading and writing takes time; we will be working to develop these good habits. Any time homework is NOT assigned to the students, he/she should continue to work on reading skills by reading at home each night.

grading OLICY

Students will have formative assessments (daily assignments and participation) and summative assessments (test, quizzes, projects, essays). Students will receive a rubric outlining the expectations when a project or essay is assigned. All assignments will be percentage based.

70 - 79 = C

60 - 69 = D

59 or below = F

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


Rate WORK


Property of Leola School




Participation
